Findings from Lansdowne Wellhead Protection Area Study to be presented

The Cataraqui Source Protection Committee is hosting a public open house on **Tuesday**, **November 24** to present the findings from their study of the municipal wells in Lansdowne.

The open house takes place from 5:00 to 8:00 p.m. at the Township of Leeds and Thousand Islands Council Chamber in Lansdowne.

There will be a **presentation** by Cataraqui Region Conservation Authority (CRCA) staff and Intera Engineering Ltd., the study consultant, at **7:00 p.m.**

"We will be presenting the draft findings from our study of the Lansdowne municipal wells," said Rob McRae, Source Protection Project Manager.

"The study looks at where the water comes from that enters the municipal wells in Lansdowne. We are also examining the effects that surrounding land uses can have on these wells."

Everyone with an interest in learning about the drinking water system in Lansdowne is welcome to attend the open house.

There will also be general information about protecting sources of drinking water and funding for landowners to help protect municipal drinking water sources.
