



Source Protection Plans across the province include policies to erect source protection road signs. Policy 4.4.1-NB in the Cataraqui Source Protection Plan is directed to the Ontario Ministry of Transportation, the Ontario Ministry of the Environment and Climate Change and local municipalities. Mary Wooding from the Ministry of the Environment and Climate Change is here today to explain the Provincial source protection roads signs initiative. Before we hear from Mary, I want to quickly provide some local context.

- MTO and MOECC with SPAs design a sign
- MTO manufacture, install and maintain signs in WHPAs and IPZs with score greater than 8
- MTO consider additional signs along Highway 33
- Municipalities purchase, install and maintain signs on municipal arterial roads in WHPAs and IPZs

These are the main points from the signage policy in the Cataraqui Source Protection Plan.

I wanted to point out that since our source protection plan includes transportation corridors, municipalities that have received Source Protection Implementation Funding are able to cover the cost of sign purchase and installation, as well as related local education and outreach.

Erin is now passing out a spreadsheet that shows the likely / approximate locations for road signs in the Cataraqui Source Protection Area.
